Granville Boys High School is immensely proud of their academic performance. **Sixty six percent** of applicants to the University Admissions Centre **gained a place at University**. The boys received their just deserts for hard work and persistence. The staff gave time and concern to the students and the students devoted hours to study and revision. This is the best performance by a cohort for some time.

Khazem Elkheir will study Business Law at the University of Technology Sydney where an ATAR of 97.2 is required for entry. Ibrahim Jomaa was successful in gaining a place at the University of Sydney to study Pharmacy while Ibrahim Hosari will study Chiropractic Science at Macquarie University. Atilla Ogun is about to commence a Bachelor of Aviation Management at University of NSW while a large number of boys will study Medical Science, Business, Communications, Information Technology and Construction at the University of Western Sydney. The boys were extremely grateful to the staff at the school and to their families for their support and this makes me especially proud of them.




This elephant is missing a leg...or is it? The artist confuses his

## SUPPORT UNIT REPORT

Welcome to a great and busy 2012 here in the Support Faculty.

We have finally completed The Support Unit's Individual Educational Planning Meetings with parents and students. I would like to thank all the parents who participated in these meetings and assisted their sons to set new goals to aim towards.

As of week 3, all students from year 9 to year 12 were involved in a work placement program which was conducted by the Careers Adviser. This program sees each student take up a position of employment at a local business. Most students have now been placed in new positions in the local community and go to Work Experience every Friday. In 2010 we had a successful year, as students gained apprenticeships and full time work through this program. Students are developing and up-dating their Resumes during class. This is an ongoing process and very important to their work experience placements and future post – school pathways.

We are very fortunate to have the Get Ready Program running this year in conjunction with Granville Youth Centre. Year 9 and 10 students participate in this program each Thursday. Granville Boys High would like to thank the new youth workers Chris Baker and Tanya Hills, who have been so welcoming and enthusiastic towards our students. Some of the activities the boys have participated have been Master Chef Pizza making and managing anger.

Granville Youth Centre is located at 3A Memorial Drive, Granville which is next to Granville Pools. Each Monday they run a Homework Club from 4pm till 6pm. All students can come free of charge and obtain help with their assessment tasks or general homework tasks.



## MATHEMATICS REPORT

2012 has started with great enthusiasm and rush of activities for teachers, students and parents as we all prepare for another year of successful teaching and learning. I would like to welcome all students back to school, particularly the year 7's who are attending high school for the first time and also a warm welcome to the new students across the year who joined Granville Boys in 2012. While visiting classrooms this term, I have observed that students are engaged in learning Mathematics and actively participate in discussions. Most students are very enthusiastic to learn and have demonstrated good organisational skills. Many students seek further help from teachers during their recess and lunch breaks. This is an excellent indicator that students value learning and want to be successful.

#### NAPLAN

Years 7 and 9 will sit for the National assessment NAPLAN in May this year. This year our focus is year 9's.Teachers issue students with NAPLAN preparation booklets every week. Students are expected to complete the booklet during the week. Teachers have allocated specific times to go over the booklets with students so as to clarify doubts and offer help. Parents are encouraged to help their children complete the booklets. Starting from week 6 of this term, teachers in the Maths faculty will offer help to students during the lunch break. Students who would like to receive extra help must see their Maths teacher for details.

#### MATHLETICS

This year again, the school has invested a large sum of money to purchase the interactive learning software, Mathletics, for students in years 7 to 10. All students will soon be given passwords that allow access to Mathletics both at home and in school. Teachers will set focus activities, home work, and tests through Mathletics, which gives instant feedback to both the student and the teacher. The lessons set on Mathletics are based on the teaching program planned for the particular classes in 2012. Maths Live games and competitions develop mathematical skills in students through interactive activities and are enjoyed by all students. Classroom teachers allocate a period of their teaching time to encourage learning through Mathletics. Students must remember to bring their laptops on that day. All students must spend some time at home on Mathletics every week. I would like parents to encourage their children to practice Mathematics on Mathletics.

#### **AUSTRALIAN MATHEMATICS COMPETITION**

Students across all years are given the opportunity to participate in Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC) each year. The AMC gives students an opportunity to experience doing a test prepared by an external agency and compare their achievements with other students in the state. Certificates of distinction, Credit and Participation are issued to the participants. Westpac awards are also given to students who do very well. Students, who wish to attempt AMC this year, must pay an entry fee of \$5.50 to the front office by the 10<sup>th</sup> of May, 2012. See the organiser of the competition, Mrs Khan, in the Maths staffroom for details.

## **HSC TUTORIALS**

From past good practices, the Maths faculty has realised that offering HSC help at school boosts student confidence greatly and encourages them to prepare well for assessments and the HSC. Those students who participated in the HSC tutorials in 2011 showed a significant improvement in their HSC Mathematics.

Considering how much difference the tutorials made in student achievement, the Maths faculty has begun offering HSC tutorials from week 5 of this term. (23<sup>rd</sup> February). Tutorials will be held on Thursdays from 3 to 4pm. One or more Maths teachers will be available to help students in their areas of need. Students who would like to take advantage of this offer of help can see their Maths teacher to get a permission note. Year 11 students who would like to take advantage of this opportunity are also welcome.

#### **MEMBERSHIP: MATHS ONLINE**

Maths Online is an interactive learning resource for schools. It caters for the learning needs of all students from Kindergarten to Year 12, in all the Maths courses. In 2011, students were able to access it for free; however, in 2012 there is a fee payable to use Maths Online. Parents can purchase a 12 month license for \$197 per student on their own. However, through the school, students can get access to Maths Online at cheaper rate of \$10 per person. All students are asked to have membership to Maths Online in 2012. You can access more information about Maths Online by following the links below. Students can pay their \$10 to the front office or to their Maths teacher who will deposit the money for them.

At this time students should go over all the work they have completed in this subject to date.

Naplan is a big focus for student in years 7-9; parents can buy NAPLAN practice books in book shops, some newsagents and some post offices. These are great to have at home for students to work through independently and with you. If your son is working through these books and is having difficulty he is welcome to attend the homework club to receive some help.
